Cantonese Restaurant Tsui Hang Village Re-opens Today Continuing a Tradition of Excellence with a New Contemporary Look

Tsui Hang Village under Miramar Group has firmly established itself in the authentic Cantonese culinary scene with quality dim sum and Guangdong old-time classics. Following the revamp of the outlets, Tsui Hang village Tsimshatsui opens today in a new location on 5/F of Miramar Shopping Centre. It will continue a tradition of excellence with a brand new look.

Diners are welcomed by the spacious dining area with floor to ceiling windows letting in plenty of light in. Floral décor resembling waves of red and orange corals hangs down from above adds a touch of vibrancy to the calm and elegant space. The complete renovation totaled HK\$20m and contemporary interior features silhouettes of the kingfisher which echo nicely with romantic views of the Kowloon Park across the street. The column-free dining space can accommodate 25 banquet tables for wedding celebrations; whereas VIP rooms overlooking the lush gardens of the park will easily become one of the best venues for business gatherings and private functions.

Cantonese cuisine touts skillful cooking techniques, use of diverse ingredients, and the perfect marinate and seasoning in creating cherished flavours. And for 37 years, Tsui Hang Village has revived and updated traditional tastes to bring diners everything from regional favourites to nourishing menus, and from tasty dim sum to festive offerings and fine tea and wine selections.

Executive Chef Chan has over 24 years of experience at renowned hotels and restaurants in Hong Kong and Japan. Skilled at bringing together ingredients from the East and West to create inspiring dishes, he brings with him must-tried new tastes to Tsui Hang Village. In **Baked Chicken with Preserved Vegetables**, **Shredded Pork and Mushrooms wrapped in Lotus Leaves** (HK\$480), the chicken is stuffed with hearty ingredients such as Sichuan preserved vegetables, canopy, shredded pork, and Chinese mushrooms before it is wrapped in fresh lotus leaves and bread crumbs and baked whole for two hours until the tender meat falls off the bones. A special mango preserve brings an appetising sour tang to the crunchy fresh prawns in **Fried King Prawns in Mango Sauce Topped with Caviar** (HK\$288). The sweet Chinese zucchini balances the rich taste of salted duck egg yokes that coat the golden fried scallops in **Fried Scallops in Salted Egg Yolk Sauce** (HK\$108), **Wok Seared Sea Bass in Premium Light Soy Sauce** (HK\$168), and the award-winning **Fried Rice with Conpoy, Dried Fish and Roast Duck Meat** (HK\$128) on the menu.

Raising a toast to the reopening of the Tsimshatsui outlet, "Tsui Hang Signature Dinner Menus" is now available at both outlets (HK\$268 including service charge) where one four can dine for the price of three. The Menu features both best-loved and brand new dishes including **Shredded Boneless Chicken**, **Boiled Shark's Fin Soup with Bird's Nest**, **Stir Fried Vermicelli with Crab Meat**, **Bean Sprouts and Scrambled Eggs**, **Crispy Bread topped with Milk Custard**, and **Braised Fish Maw and Sea Coconut with Tientsin Cabbage**.
